

ABOUT US

Kurdish Association for New Generations/ Abroad (**KANGA**) is a Non- Government International Organization located in London. **KANGA** is a non-for-profit Company Limited by Guarantee, which was set up in June 2018.

KANGA is an umbrella organization, that is responsible for five branches of Kurdish Supplementary Schools inside and outside of London and six online classes. Currently, we have nearly 350 Kurdish and non-Kurdish children who benefit from our services.

KANGA is dedicated to run a range of Supplementary schools, which offers educational opportunities for Children and Young People (CYP) outside mainstream school provisions. We provide for Kurdish and non-Kurdish **BAMER** (Black, Asian, Minority Ethnic and Refugee) Communities. Our services are heavily run by volunteers and sessional workers.

Our supplementary schools are based within the communities that we serve, so our beneficiaries can respond to specific needs and issues within their communities. They can provide targeted educational support from a shared cultural and/or linguistic perspective and provide children from Minority Ethnic Communities, with dedicated and hard-working role models from their own cultural backgrounds.

KANGA provides services to CYP up to the age of 25 and their parents whose mother tongue is not the principal language of the country where they are living.

What do we do?

Our Supplementary schools exist to raise the attainment of CYP. We provide a variety of learning opportunities in core curriculum subjects such as: Math's, English, Science and **KANGA** also frequently offers extra-curricular activities, like Arts and Sports.

In addition, our organization will make a difference to Kurdish people through providing Mother – Tongue Kurdish classes so that our children will be able to speak, read and write in Kurdish. **KANGA** looks at Mother-tongue as a cultural element on one hand, and as bilingual, bicultural and /or multi-cultural elements on the other hand.

In addition to all above, our organization is the only Kurdish International Organization which provides its services to CYP Nationally and Internationally. Our organization has unique aims and objectives which are specifically tailored to the best interest of CYP. We have qualified teachers and staff who are able to capably deliver the weekly sessions with the children and young people.

The main aims of our organization

KANGA is a dedicated organization that aims to serve Children and Young People and their families in the fields of welfare, education, arts and entertainments. **KANGA** promotes equality, diversity, social inclusion and eliminates discrimination. We deliver this through weekly educational lessons and workshops in our supplementary schools.

KANGA's services

Our activities are to highlight our multi – identity, belief in belonging to the Kurdish and British societies, cultures and diversity that help our CYP to integrate.

Our supplementary school currently operates 3 hours per week on Saturday (32 weeks) during which we run 3 different classes based on age groups. Parents will benefit from Functional English / Math's support with the help of Excel Education based at: 12b, Suffolk House, College Rd, London CR0 1PE.

KANGA runs a supplementary school for primary and secondary school children and delivers a range of educational services/activities as well as health and wellbeing advice to support National and International community members, these includes:

- Provide Mother-tongue Sorani Kurdish Language Classes.
- Provide Literacy, Numeracy, English and Maths lessons for Key stage 2 and 3.
- Teach the children arts, music and dance.
- Assist children with their mainstream homework to those children who struggle with schoolwork.
- Provide support sessions for pre- GCSE children and those preparing for GCSE exams.
- Provide Cultural and Heritage activities.

- Provide a range of activities for the parents such as Health and Well-being sessions/workshops with the support of local women's organization, and also functional skills English and Maths (with the support of Excel Education).
